THE PRESS RELEASE:

Outspoken and oft times controversial, author G. Benjamin Eubanks is rewriting conventional interpretations of history, in this historical thriller set in 1916, prior to the United States entry into the First World War.

By early 1916 of the First World War, the combatants realized the war, as it then stood, was unwinnable by either, the British, French and Russians, or the Germans, Turks and Austrians. The British saw their only way out of the stalemate was to convince the United States to join them in the war; while at the same time the Germans realized that all would be lost if the United States entered the War against them.

Thrown into the mix are the Zionist Jews, who were turned down by the Turks when they offered their assistance against the British and the French in return for a homeland in Palestine after the war; and who then, threw themselves into the conflict on the side of the British – persuaded by the creation, of the then secret, Balfour Doctrine which promised the Zionist Jews a homeland in Palestine, if and only if, the war ended successfully for the British.

Against this background, the British, the Zionist Jews and the Germans find themselves in a direct confrontation in the southwestern United States, with the Germans becoming the patrons of Pancho Villa. The Germans encouraged General Villa, whose fortunes had fallen to their lowest ebb, to attack the United States at Columbus, New Mexico; and subsequently to attempt to assassinate former President Teddy Roosevelt.

This assassination was to take place at the Gila National Monument in New Mexico which ex-President Roosevelt had created in 1905. This attempt drags into the conspiracy a diverse and fascinating cast of characters, including a Federal Judge, a Chiricahua Apache named Two Chickens and absolutely the worst ‘bad man’ in modern historical fiction.

Each of these characters have their own history and enmities dating back to the Spanish American War of 1898, which taken together make the exciting climax of the book all the more entertaining.

Thus the stage is set towards a fast paced and violent end.

The author has presented an entirely new perspective on the actual events of that March 9, 1916 attack on Columbus, New Mexico, and placed that event within the context of World events that are highly likely to be closer to the truth than anyone has come before.

At the end of the day, one must ask the horrible question about the collaboration of the British and the Zionist Jews: was this the Jewish Conspiracy that, twenty years later, would provide the provocation for the worst mass murderer in history, Adolph Hitler; and his attempt to extinguish an entire race of people?

Is this a work of historical fiction or an interpretation of those events with a perspective all too close to reality; and events which affect our World even after nearly 100 years?

The Roosevelt Gambit is so thoroughly researched and so well written that it may hardly be fiction after all.

And when we mention Dr. Eubanks as a controversial figure, let me offer an example; when asked recently about his opinion of modern politics and politicians: He very succinctly said of politics: “When I think of politicians, an old saying where I come from springs instantly into my mind, which is, “Don’t piss down my back and tell me it’s raining.”
